The Beginning

CARESCO is a registered charity founded in 1982. In the mid-1970s a number of community groups were set up in the village, including a Day Centre for the elderly, held at Sawtry Village College and a Lunch Club where people could prepare and share a meal together, held in the Homecraft Centre. After a few years, the original organisers had to move on and, rather than losing these groups, a steering committee was formed and *CARESCO* was born.

Over the years a variety of projects have been brought under the *CARESCO* umbrella, each run by paid staff and supported by teams of volunteers; working together with local authorities and other voluntary organisations towards a stronger, more caring community.

In 2001 *CARESCO* moved into an all new purpose built modular building funded by a grant from the National Lottery bringing most of the projects under one roof.

Sheila Lloyd was elected as a new trustee and during the year Sarah James was co-opted to the committee. I should like publicly to welcome both to the fold. While I would never discuss a lady's age, I am sure they will contribute to reducing the committee's average.

This is not the flippant point it may seem. Over the years people have been very loyal to **CARESCO** as trustees, volunteers, staff and as customers. This has been a strength. The organisation is ageing though and renewal is one of the key issues we face. I look forward to seeing younger, or at least less old, people involved in all our activities. Following the last Annual General Meeting Derek Armitage stood down, or more correctly did not seek to be reappointed as Treasurer. I should like to record my and the Committee's thanks to Derek for the very significant contribution he made as Treasurer. In tough financial circumstances it was always good to be able to rely on Derek to be on top of the figures and to provide clear messages to the Committee about the important financial issues.

Towards the end of his time as Treasurer Derek was starting to look at the costs of individual projects and we plan to carry that work on in the future. Derek remains a trustee. As the other members of the Committee were not currently in a position to take

I am grateful to our fire officer, Dave Baldry, for organising our regular fire drills, testing the smoke alarms and so on. It is a thankless task which he does with good will. Should we ever have to vacate the building quickly, we all know what to do and can do it at quite an impressive speed even with wheelchairs and walking frames.

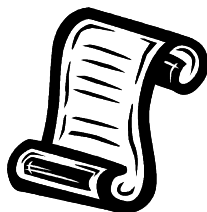

Finance continues to be a major issue for **CARESCO**. Our County Council grant for 2008/9 has increased by 1% and while this is better than the static position we have been in for many years it is still a cut in real terms. It is our hope that at some point we may have a proper contract for a realistic price to provide our services.

Inevitably once again, much of our attention over the year has been on raising funds and in that respect I should like to thank Angela and Tim Newell for the very significant contribution made by their splendid hog roast in the summer of 2007 and also thanks to the Vocal Academy for their substantial donation following the Evelyn Glennie concert last year. We are also grateful for the continued support of the local churches, clubs, pubs and individual donations.

With our grants more or less static, simple arithmetic tells us that our need to raise funds will increase at a faster rate than inflation. This has led to the formation of a fledgling fundraising sub-group. We hope in time it may grow. Again, please let Liz know if you would like to be involved.

It was with much regret that we learned in January this year of the sad death of Ernest Reed. Ernest and his wife Joy had both served as trustees and Ernest was a volunteer driver with the lunch club over many years. He is much missed by those who knew him.

Finally, I should like to thank Liz and the staff and all the volunteers who contribute so much to making **CARESCO** the success it undoubtedly is. We have something to be proud of and I look forward to working with you over the coming year in order to maintain and build on that success.

Manager's Report

It is an amazing privilege to work at the centre of this fantastic organisation. Although each of our projects operate relatively independently of each other, they all co-ordinate through the middle and mainly share the same facilities. In the office we have to deal daily with an incredible range of enquiries from both the general public and people within the organisation.



Through the year staff members and volunteers have continued to attend relevant training courses including a couple on the current issue of abuse awareness. Sadly in our society it is becoming recognised that many elderly people suffer abuse in one form or another. Staff members have learnt how to recognise the signs of abuse and what to do should abuse be suspected. All our day care staff have undergone checks with the Criminal Records Bureau and under new guidelines we will be looking to have all our volunteers checked likewise. No one today is able to work with children without being checked and it is now accepted that vulnerable adults should have the same level of protection. It is not that we have any concerns about our current staff or volunteers, but that we need to be able to show that we have taken steps to ensure the best care for our clients.

Over the years **CARESCO** has grown and adapted to meet current need in the local community. The resulting set up is rather complicated and not easy to explain. Our aim in the coming year is to review where we are now and to develop a simple understanding of the structure within **CARESCO**. In addition we also want to improve the way we communicate outside the charity so that people know what it is we do.

As always I must thank all our volunteers, staff and users of our services, particularly Marina whose quiet support in the office I could not manage without. **CARESCO** is an amazing and unique organisation and one of which we can be rightly proud.

Sawtry Village Car Scheme

Aims: To provide a community transport scheme for anyone who has difficulty using public transport.



Sawtry Village Car Scheme provides door-to-door transport for people who do not have the use of a car and are unable to use conventional public transport. Journeys are arranged through a co-ordinator and provided by volunteers using their own cars.

CARESCO plays a supportive role in the Scheme by providing a local contact for the drivers and a place for their regular meetings. We also produce the local publicity and put occasional articles in the Sawtry Eye. **CARESCO** does not man the phones to take the bookings, this is done by the Thrapston Volunteer Centre (TVC). The number of lifts provided has increased from last year, and is manageable for the number of drivers currently signed up for the scheme. Should you have a car and be willing to make yourself available, please get in touch on the number above.

My thanks to all our drivers who so willingly and cheerfully give up their time to be available. I know they are appreciated by their passengers, many of whom would otherwise be unable to get out. Even to get to the village shops or doctors' surgery can be impossible for people who can't walk far or get on a bus.

Thank you also to Lorrie Brooks and all at TVC for managing the Scheme. They do a fantastic service for Sawtry and the surrounding area.

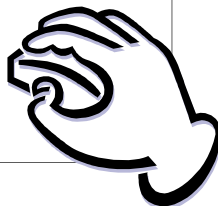

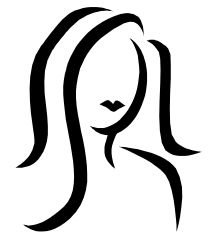
It has been a busy year again, we seem to have got through a lot of clothes and hangers!

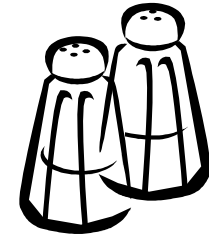
We use a selection of the monthly updates, with permission, in the Sawtry Eye as 'General Information' where we think they will be of interest to our local community.
