

#### SAWTRY HISTORY SOCIETY



We are now opening the History Archive on the Saturday following our Thursday meetings, in the Community Centre access via the library, from 10:00 to 12:00.

All are welcome, search census records and view old documents relating to the Sawtry area.

The subject of our January meeting was *Huntingdonshire Criminals Transported to Australia & Their Crimes* presented by Annie James, Local Historian & Family History Researcher. A really good insight into the attitudes of society in the 18th Century to crime and punishment. The system actually worked out to be a much more positive future for some of those who were transported as they prospered better in the new lands than they would have done at home. Conditions on board ship were pretty grim, as they had been on the prison hulks that preceded them, many died on the voyages although some returned having served their time.

Our February meeting saw *The Great Whyte Tunnels in Ramsey* presented by Clive Beeke, Ramsey history enthusiast. An in-depth look at the water system that takes the river under the street known as the Great Whyte. Whyte' comes from the Anglo Saxon for dock or docking area. The river was open and used for trade, it was the main artery for Ramsey Abbey. Ironically it was used to transport the stone from the Abbey to Cambridge for University building projects after the dissolution. Although the river is at times not much more than a large stream, in the winter of 2020 it flooded the golf course and at one point entering the tunnels it was 18 feet deep.

The proposed tour of Cromwell Museum and Courtroom in June has been revised to be the return of our Sawtry Abbey Walk, look out for details.

# QUINTUPLICATION - PART FOURTEEN UNDER YOUR FEET

In the years in question, 1963 to 1993, when the village quintuplicated, land was forever being dug up and sometimes this revealed interesting history. In 1977, Harry Milford wrote the following for our Parish Directory:

'It is known that an ancient tribe called Hirstina, who liked to live in wooded districts, inhabited the Woodwalton and Upwood area. Sawtry had a Romano-British settlement South East of Tort Hill and the area is full of the possibility of interesting finds.

Newton Road and Manor Drive are sited. It was exposed about two feet below the present ground. After a lot of searching and digging I found several different types of pottery and half of a polished slate axe-head of the Neolithic Period, about six or seven thousand years old. It would be nice to think that this was dropped by a Sawtry Neolithic man and not carted there with stones brought for that road.

Under the soil I also found, 2 ½ feet down, a large pot jar. Inside it were some bits of bone, shells and two flint tools. A pot like this, found in Castor, is known to be of Roman origin. The only coin I found here was an Elizabeth I sixpence. These coins were used by shepherd boys as engagement rings since they were so thin they could be wrapped round a girl's finger.

At the side of a pond at the East end of the field I found many clay pipes, stems and bowls. This was a rubbish dump belonging to a 17<sup>th</sup> Century dwelling whose foundation and cobbled yard I traced close by.

While the foundations for the Infants School were being dug I had a look round. I found some glass pottery and some rusty metal but nothing of any worth. Down in the newer part of Louth Way I found an old button of the type that was used on Red Coat Soldiers' tunics.

Before the Chequers pub (on the Green) closed, and much to the amusement of the customers and passers-by, I dug that garden from end to end. I found two coins. One was a lead cast Greek token, at one time coated with silver. On the obverse was the Goddess Diana with her hounds, and the reverse had two men shooting snakes with bows and arrows. The other coin was a Roman tetrodacma, minted in Alexandria for use in Egypt 283-5 AD.

And in my own garden I have dug up some green and brown glazed pottery which is 12<sup>th</sup> Century. There are many other interesting finds by others and these are (or were) on show."



#### Covid Booster Vaccinations - Spring 2023

As you may already be aware, the government have recently announced that there will be another Covid booster vaccination for particular groups of vulnerable patients. This programme is due to start early April. At the time of

writing, we are not yet able to confirm how patients will access this vaccination as local delivery plans have not been finalised. We will publicise more information as soon as it becomes available via our website and posters in the practice.

#### Repeat Prescriptions

As many of you will already be aware, we have recently had to close our practice dispensary. As a result, we no longer have a dispensary team to manage the repeat prescription requests coming into the practice. For considerable years now we have operated on a request turnaround time of 48 hours (2 working days). Please be aware that as of March our turnaround reverted to our contractual requirement of 72 hours (3 working days). Please bear this in mind when submitting your request.

If you are not already placing your repeat medication requests online we would ask you to consider doing so if you are able to. This may result in a quicker turnaround time, reduces the possibility of errors and provides a fully auditable trail in the event of any queries. You can place your orders via the NHS App or see our reception team for an application form.

#### Zero Tolerance Policy – a gentle reminder

Sadly I have had cause to write to a small number of patients recently reminding them of the way in which we expect all members of the practice team to be treated.



#### EMERGING FROM THE PANDEMIC

As we started to emerge from the pandemic, I thought a lot about how we could mark that season in our churches, how we changed, how we grew, how we adjusted, how we hoped, how we loved.

Kathryn Dailly is a gifted textile artist and creates in her spare time. I particularly love her work. As the churchyard had been such a special part of our growth in lockdown and throughout the pandemic I wanted to reflect that and bring some of the outside in. I spoke to Kathryn about an idea I had to make new banners for the altar at All Saints', a way of remembering the season we were emerging from. She has created two stunning banners, incorporating the theme of nature. The Bible text across both reads:






