

SAWTRY HISTORY SOCIETY

We are now opening the History Archive on the Saturday following our Thursday meetings, in the Community Centre access via the library, from 10:00 to 12:00.

All are welcome, search census records and view old documents relating to the Sawtry area.

The subject of our May meeting was **What The Romans Did For Us.... In The Kitchen** the return of Chris Carr Local Historian & Re-enactor. We were shown authentic kitchen utensils and various recipes including a fish sauce. The Romans were responsible for introducing many varieties of vegetable that we still use today, such as cabbage, onion, leek, shallots, carrots, endive, globe artichokes, cucumber, marrow, asparagus, parsnip, turnip, radish and celery. The most important fruit that they brought to Britain was the grape, cheers Romans!

Unfortunately the planned walk for June at the Sawtry Abbey site had to be cancelled, the grass had not been cropped in the usual yearly way. This made the rough terrain more difficult to negotiate, a potential safety issue. Also the length of the grass meant that most of the features were much more difficult to see as there are no standing walls. We hope to reorganise it in the future.

The other bad news is there has been insufficient interest in the trip to the Churchill War Rooms and the Victoria & Albert museum so that also will not go ahead.

There will be a feature page every month on the Sawtry History website which is now run by Marilyn Gautreaux www.sawtryhistory.co.uk. If there is something you would like her to feature on it, just let her know sawtryhistory@gmail.com. There will also be an 'In Focus Item' something of local interest.



supported by Cambridgeshire police, who monitor the speed of vehicles travelling through our village at various locations. Any communication sent to those exceeding the speed limit comes from Cambridgeshire Police and will indicate where, when and what speed you were travelling - if it is anything other than that it didn't come from us.

We have been carrying out our campaign to try and educate drivers to adhere to the speed limit for several years now and have seen the percentage of speeders drop from almost 50% to between 10% and 20% so we really feel we have achieved something. As the volume of traffic continues to increase, we do still feel it is necessary to continue the campaign to try and retain or even reduce that percentage further.

It was so lovely to do our bit for Sawtry Carnival by ensuring the parade route was clear of litter. Sawtry Litter Pickers even helped out on the day to make sure the site remained clear. Such a wonderful family atmosphere and so well organised, everyone seemed to be having an amazing day. We are so lucky in this village to have people who volunteer their own time and think of all the small details to make the Carnival such an amazing success.

Unfortunately we still have some problem areas, including the bus stops, Bill Hall Way, Toll Bar and the old A1 to name a few. We clear the area but the following day there is more, just makes us shudder what state it would be in if we didn't clear it week in and week out. Just don't understand the mentality when there is litter right next to the bin, think we need Tom Gosling to share his tutorial recording on how to use a bin.

One of our team came across so much litter near Woodwalton, they spent some considerable time collecting and bagging up. Thank you Rosalyn, much appreciated.

It was so wonderful to see the road sweeper out and about around Sawtry, this has saved us so much as there are often cigarette butts and rubbish just by the kerb - hope this continues as it made such a difference to the village.

We met with the Huntingdonshire District Council Waste and Recycling Operations Manager to see how they can provide us with support. Thank you for your time and your positive input, looking forward to working closely with you. One of the issues we can all help with is to ensure that our waste bins are shut, especially on waste collection days as there is often litter escaping and this can be a nightmare for our waste collectors and litter pickers.

HDC continue to provide fabulous support in responding to fly tipping, so please use their site to report any that you notice as it only takes a minute. We are having an issue with the grass cutting in the village, one piece of litter multiples when it has been through a lawn mower. There is also the danger from the sharp cans and broken bottles that create such a health issue to people and wildlife.

We are very lucky that APPS Canopies have generously provide us with #littlelitterpickerheroes hi vis for our younger members to ensure they are clearly visible - THANK YOU. The children love wearing the hi vis and are proud to be part of the Sawtry Litter Pickers and often engage with people as they go out and about, so please take the time to stop and talk to them. There are also Year 7s at Sawtry Academy regularly collecting litter around the school, so it is good to know the next generation are taking a keen interest and it is lovely to see the clear grounds.

The collection bags do seem to be getting smaller, so we feel we are making progress. The various members continue to go out and about week in week out as such a fabulous group. We have some new eager members, who have been getting stuck in to clearing various areas throughout the village, including the skate park. AN EYE ON NATURE

As winter turns to spring I keep a look out in the sky above Sawtry, waiting for the return of our iconic travellers - swifts, house martins and swallows. After such a long hot summer last year, I wondered how they had fared. The first house martins and swallows showed up on the 25 April, flying low over the grass in St Judith's Field. They were few in number but here none the less. Only the swifts to go now, I thought and sure enough, on the 4 May the first two birds flew over Middlefield Road. Looking back at my records they are amazingly consistent, arriving within a few days in early May each year.

It was time to get the last four swift boxes mounted on my house and they went up shortly after. All I needed now was the swifts to arrive in numbers so I could play swift calls on a special bit of kit designed for the job. Swifts flying around are attracted to the calls of nesting swifts and investigate nesting opportunities, in this case my boxes. Things don't always go according to plan though and it was several weeks before more swifts arrived over Sawtry. They are still here as I write, but have sadly not investigated my nest boxes yet, however there is still time. Springwatch this year on BBC Two highlighted the decline in swift numbers, down 60% between 1995 and 2020.

Swifts are now on the Red List of birds in urgent need of our help. It seems to be a similar story for the house martins and swallows, but thank goodness we in Sawtry still have had all three species this summer. I had a week's holiday in the Lake District this June and the village where I stayed was home to a good population of all three species. They really made my holiday, and a big bonus was that house martins were nesting above our drive. It was great to share the enthusiasm of the cottage owners where we stayed and the twittering of the house martins each morning was a wonderful greeting as we set out each day.

You may be thinking "What can I do to help?" If you are lucky enough to already play host to swallows, house martins or swifts, please retain the nest sites for next year. They are loyal to a nest site and swifts, for example, pair for life. When they return next spring they will expect their nest site to still be there. You could do as I have and put up boxes before the birds arrive as newly paired couples will also need somewhere to nest. It would be great if we could continue to make our villages swift, house martin and swallow-friendly to welcome back the harbingers of spring. I think you would agree that a summer sky missing their aerial acrobatics would be poorer indeed.

The Five Ways to Wellbeing model is a helpful tool to focus our thoughts and activities on things that will give our wellbeing a boost!

Connect:

Connect with people around you. Connect with family, with friends, colleagues and neighbours. At home, work, college or in your local community. Think of these relationships as cornerstones in your life and spend time developing them. Building these connections can support and enrich you every day.

Learn:

Try something new or rediscover an old interest. Sign up for that course. Take on a different responsibility. Fix a bike. Learn to play and instrument or how to cook a new meal. Set a challenge you will enjoy achieving. Learning new things will make you more confident as well as being fun.

Be active:

Go for a walk or run. Step outside. Cycle. Play a game. Garden. Dance. Exercise makes you feel good. Most importantly find a physical activity that you enjoy and one that suits you.

Take notice:

Be curious. Catch sight of the beautiful. Remark on the unusual. Notice the changing seasons. Savour the moment, whether you are out walking, eating lunch, or talking with friends. Be aware of the world around you and what you are feeling. Reflecting on your experiences will help you to appreciate what matters to you. Mindfulness is another way to practice noticing and being more aware in everyday situations and can help us manage the way we feel and create relaxing and calm moments. If you have access to the internet you can listen to some guided Mindfulness Practice to help you get started.

Give:

Do something nice for a friend or a stranger. Thank someone. Smile. Volunteer your time. Join a community group. Look outward as well as in. Seeing yourself linked to the wider community can be incredibly rewarding and creates connections with the people around you.

What is Wellbeing?

In simple terms, wellbeing can be described as judging life positively and feeling good. People often distinguish between physical and mental wellbeing, but in fact they are intrinsically linked. People are more likely to feel good if they are physically active, have a healthy diet and sleep well.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) defines Wellbeing as "how people feel and function both on a personal and social level and how they evaluate their lives as a whole."

Being able to afford and pay for the basics in life is an essential foundation for our health and wellbeing. Without that there will always be a struggle to be healthy and feel well and engaged and purposeful in life. Inequality of any kind can impact our wellbeing.

If you experience reduced wellbeing over a long period of time, you are more likely to develop a mental health problem. If you already have a health issue, you're more likely to experience periods of low mental wellbeing than someone who hasn't.

Evidence suggests however that even a small improvement in wellbeing can help to decrease some mental health problems and help all of us to flourish.
