














# HOLME WI



October is Members Night, when our members take over our meeting and organise the guest speaker and

refreshments. They organised indoor skittles and there was a quiz to do whilst we were waiting our turn at the skittles. It was a fun evening, and everyone enjoyed themselves, there were some delicious cakes and scones for the interval as well, all made by our ladies.

November is our Annual General Meeting (AGM), so there was quite a lot of business to be discussed. However, we found the time for a lovely guest speaker, Clive Beeke. Clive gave us a talk about *The Ramsey Tunnels*. Clive has spent many years researching the tunnels and it was an extremely interesting talk about the tunnels that run under the Great Whyte.

Originally, the Great Whyte was an open watercourse, with small boats called Fenlighters, sailing up and down moving goods and people. In the 1850s it was decided the watercourse would be covered, or culverted, and eventually it became tunnels. There is one main tunnel with two smaller ones running alongside the main one. The whole exercise was to aid the flow of water, especially in time of flooding. The main tunnel chamber is directly under the clock, or 'Dummy' as the locals call it, and originally the flowing water was used to turn a propeller which in turn ran the clock. However, there was a flaw in this plan, it turned too quickly during flooding and didn't turn at all in the summer during droughts. This mechanism has now been removed although the workings can still be seen. It was an excellent talk by Clive of a very interesting subject, it was accompanied by lots of maps and photographs, which were fascinating, especially the ones showing all the old bridges that crossed the watercourse. Clive is now working on Ramsey Abbey, so we can't wait to see what he finds out about this ancient monument.

Our ladies at Knit and Knatter have been very busy, and another parcel of baby clothes and blankets is being sent off for children fleeing the Ukrainian conflict.

We meet on the first Thursday of each month, anyone interested in seeing what we get up to do come along to Holme Village Hall, we open our meeting at 7.30pm.

### SAWTRY HISTORY SOCIETY

We are now opening the Archive on the Saturday following our Thursday meeting, in Sawtry Library from 9:30 to 12:30. All are welcome to search census records and view old documents relating to our area or just look at old photographs of Sawtry and its institutions.


Our September meeting was about The Emperor Carausious (nothing to do with Star Wars) with a return of one of our popular contributors, Paddy Lambert of Oxford Archaeology. A tale in which Marcus Aurelius Mausaeus Carausius (died 293) was a military commander of the Roman Empire in the third century. He was a Menapian from Belgic Gaul, who usurped power in 286, during the Carausian Revolt, declaring himself Emperor in Britain and northern Gaul. He held power for seven years, fashioning the name "Emperor of the North" for himself before being assassinated by his finance minister.

In October, just in time for 5 November, Stuart Orme curator of the Cromwell Museum returned, the subject being The Gunpowder Plot. The talk was packed with facts about the events leading up to the planned explosion along with the background of the conspirators. Guy (Guido) Fawkes, a soldier who had fought in Spain topped up the barrels of gunpowder stockpiled under the House of Lords as the opening of Parliament had been delayed, he worried that the original stock could have degraded. So a total of 36 barrels were prepared for detonation. Had they exploded, the area would have been flattened and everyone in the buildings killed along with many of the surrounding population, an equivalent disaster for the time to that of the 9-11 attack on the Twin Towers.

# QUINTUPLICATION - PART TWELVE COMMUNICATION

With that five-fold population growth (1963-1993) newcomers needed to know what was going on. Many must have come from towns and we did not want them to feel that Sawtry was *the back of beyond!* 

The newly-opened Village College was a hub for much community activity and we *lubricated* this hub by issuing **Eventsheet** from 1971 five times a year to all comers and for anyone who ran events around the area. We have to thank George Chaney (the College Community Tutor) for banding people together for mutual support in the 1969 Community Association. Over 50 organisations became involved and had a voice in affairs.

In 1975 the Parish Council brought out the **Parish Directory**, for every household, listing local organisations and telling people where to get help and support. The Directory included our very first street map which, with continuing growth, soon needed extra roads drawn in. Interest grew and others, particularly advertisers, wanted a look-in. So, there were regular updates. Then, the Parish Church produced a **Welcome Pack** for newcomers.

**Village Voice** was a 1975 trial at a regular village magazine. Then a firm start was made when the Community Printshop opened, printing the **Sawtry Eye** which had been started by the Parish Clerk. The Printshop began as a Job Creation Project in the former Homecraft Building at the County Agricultural Centre. When that Project folded, thanks to a national employment revival, Sawtry volunteers, under CARESCO, took over. Distribution of the Eye to all homes was undertaken by various groups including the Scouts (no internet in those days).

As any newspaper shows us communication needs to be two ways. People need a say in things. In Fenland, drainage is always a challenge and in Sawtry, perched on a hillside, rapid runoff from rain could be a serious worry. New villagers soon found this out, and they had a champion in George Chaney. Between retiring from the College and becoming Parish Council Chairman, he spoke up strongly for public participation, particularly on this, his favourite subject. His mantra: 'The Creative use of Conflict' enraged many. But it got things done.

A growing village has to meet many needs besides adequate housing, and people are right to point out those needs. The Parish Council sought to establish strong links around which people could voice their concerns. They produced **Annual Reports**, from 1977, long before these became commonplace elsewhere, so that people could know what the Council was doing. Each committee (Planning, Allotments, Rural Amenities, Church & State, Feast, Health, Directory, and Major Emergency) gave account of itself as did the District and County representatives. Our local MP John Major, a regular and supportive visitor, also contributed a page


each year. And all were welcomed to the Annual Meeting to ask questions and participate.

And, when issues got pressing, like the need for sports fields or a slow-down on housing, there would be a well-attended Public Meeting!

So, it was not only drainage that brought us together!



### AN EYE ON NATURE

Our wildlife has suffered a huge shock this year. All of us basked in hot sunshine week after week through the summer with virtually no rain. The natural world was stressed and confused. My sparrows needed peanuts throughout the summer and my meadow wilted in the constant heat.

You may nave noticed what happened in the autumn too. I looked out of my bedroom to see white on my rowan tree as it flowered again and was in berry. The general public have also noticed bazaar happenings including a photo on tv of a horse chestnut tree with fresh brown conkers and in full bloom again. There were also lots of photos of what is called a 'false autumn' where the trees and shrubs shed their leaves due to extreme stress as they tried to save themselves from dying out beyond redemption. I lost one dogwood, but the other only shed its leaves then when rain eventually fell, the shower was enough for it to grow little green leaves.

As I write in early November, we have had several days of torrential rain, so what the winter will be like is anyone's guess. Next spring will be different again and we will have to wait to see what has survived.

Our summer was not all doom and gloom though. Wildlife which loves hot sunny weather flourished and there were a lot of hummingbird hawk moths well into October. As I finished this article, a red admiral butterfly was having a late drink from the valerian which was still flowering. Thank goodness I left them alone this autumn for the butterflies and bumble bees before they hibernated.

# SIMON & ROSS DISTRICT & COUNTY COUNCILLORS

We have had a busy, and often very frustrating, couple of months since we last wrote to you.

As well as giving Sawtry a strong voice our biggest role is scrutinising, challenging, and holding the new and often inexperienced administration to account; at Huntingdonshire District Council (HDC) and Simon also does the same role at Cambridgeshire County Council.

Swimming Pool - It was very sad to hear that Meridian Trust have taken the decision to moth ball the swimming pool at the end of December 2022. Swimming is a vital life skill for our young people and losing the pool disadvantages the tax payer of the Sawtry district. Unfortunately the current climate is a "perfect storm" with energy bills going up; shortage of vital supplies; Covid insecurity and attendance, which has led to claims the pool no longer be financially viable. Taking the required capital from the education budget, to cover the deficit, is something Meridian can't do. Please be reassured we are continuing to explore any available options.

**904 Buses** - We were very disappointed to hear the Stagecoach decision to reduce the 904 bus timetable. This bus is often a lifeline for residents connecting Sawtry and surrounding villages to Huntingdon and Peterborough. The 904 has become unreliable and clearly a last bus out of Huntingdon at 4.45pm not fit for purpose when people need to work or attend appointments. We believe this isn't acceptable and will continue to lobby on your behalf.

**Pets as Prizes -** On a far more positive note, we managed to get our motion to ban pets being given as prizes on HDC land. This was supported across the chamber by all parties. By doing this we are sending a clear message, thank you to all the residents who raised this issue/idea with us.





Unfortunately, due to the warm summer we all had, Greenfield has been unplayable so far this season.
