





## **REMEMBERING LIZ COATES**

#### 1 March 1965 - 22 October 2023

Liz was a pivotal member within her church and community and has left a huge legacy at CARESCO. She was one of those special people who did so much for everyone else.

In the beginning, Liz was a CARESCO volunteer; she was Deputy Manager of the Day Centre and became General Manager in 2001 although she wore many other hats during her association with CARESCO.

She also found time to help with important village events like Carnival and Sport 4 All - often eliciting her family's assistance even if it was slap bang in the middle of Wimbledon!

In all that time she would have seen scores of staff, trustees and volunteers come and go and is only just pipped to the post for gold, in terms of longevity with the

organisation, by her dear friend and colleague Marina, with whom she worked so closely for many years.

The adage about giving something to a busy person and they'll get it done could have been invented for Liz, for she was tireless in her commitment in all she did for CARESCO. Championing and advocating us and educating us to become more environmentally friendly as a charity. AND, like many working part time, she always put in far more than her allotted hours.

Liz's knowledge of compliance and procedure, the right person to approach about a query or for information; CARESCO's evolution and history, how to fix things when they went wrong or dates you needed to check up on and who said what to whom and when - was matchless. But occasionally even Liz would have to resort to what her friend Linda Dupee, a previous Chairman of Trustees, refers to as 'The Bloomin' Yellow Book,' copies of which Liz would try to sell off at any given opportunity!

And nothing was ever too much trouble for her. If anyone went to her with a query, she'd stop whatever she was immersed in to point you in the right direction, whether you needed help, guidance, advice - or if it was a Friday - Coffee Shop day - ......a bacon sandwich.

traffic through office The her or calls to the phone could sometimes be relentless! And she never complained......perhaps that was down to the secret stash of chilli flavoured chocolate offloaded by Susie, her office compatriot, that kept Liz re-fuelled, ready to face a deluge of inquiries.....

A typical morning might sound a bit like this....

'Good Afternoon, Cambridge County Council here about the grant for......'

'Hunts Forum here, please could you call us back regarding......'

'Oh, Liz, can you remember where the bunting is for the party? Wow! You've made some more, that's so pretty.'

'Liz, the Parish Council wanted to know.....'

'Liz, what's the correct procedure for....?'

'Morning, have you any more tickets left for ....?'

'Ummmm Liz, where would I find the policy for....?'

'Liz, thanks for taking the minutes last night.'

'I wonder if you could help Liz, we need to draft an advertisement for.....'

'Liz, what happened last time we did this.....?'

I think you get the picture of the variety and intensity of the calls and questions. Like many other organisations we've had our ups and downs and if things became a bit bumpy now and then, Liz's experience, her steadying influence and unflappability have many times, helped steer us through..... Like the huge task of processing and implementing the reams of information for General Data Protection; or compiling and producing yet another annual report, and unravelling and making sense of all the protocols associated with the impact of Covid, often against the deadline of compiling and editing the Sawtry Eye at which she had been co-editor for the last 22 years.

Liz certainly set the bar for writing reports and applications over the years, and to quote our previous General Manager, Emma, Liz was pivotal in CARESCO's application process for The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service. And what a huge accolade it was for the organisation when The Lord Lieutenant of Cambridgeshire, Julie Spence, presented it to CARESCO during The Queen's Platinum Jubilee last year, reflecting the contribution made by all staff, volunteers and members throughout CARESCO's entire existence.



In short, Liz has been our oracle, our 'go to' for year-on-year since 2001 and CARESCO and all its staff, volunteers and members - past and present, are the beneficiaries of her legacy and passion for the organisation. We're sure we echo the thoughts of many of us, when we say, quite simply, that CARESCO just won't feel the same without her, and on behalf of all of us who counted her as a friend and colleague, we would like to offer our sincerest condolences to all her family.

#### THANK YOU

All of Liz's family would like to thank everyone for their support and prayers over the last few weeks. We were humbled by the number of cards we have received and the kind words of tribute that were spoken at the thanksgiving service.

From her first involvement as a volunteer over 30 years ago, Liz loved being part of the wonderful work that CARESCO does in the local community and especially working with the amazing team in the office. We are so happy that she was able to sign off as co-editor of the Sawtry Eye after 22 years in the post and know that others will continue her good work.

So far, well over £500 has been received in Liz's memory towards the work of CARESCO and the Methodist Church. Please direct any further gifts to either organisation. I can do no better than to close with the Bible verse from the book of Micah, by which she tried to live her life: "What does the Lord require of you? To act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God."

### **SAWTRY VILLAGE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN** We have made it!

At the Referendum held on Thursday 9th November 2023. 88% of the votes cast were in favour of using our Neighbourhood Plan when deciding planning applications in our neighbourhood area.

effect This result will take immediate although it is Huntingdonshire District Council will formally 'make' our Plan on 13th December 2023. This means that the Local Planning Authority will assess future planning applications in our neighbourhood area using the advice and policies in the National Planning Policy Framework, our Local Plan and our Neighbourhood Plan.

Our Plan contains eleven policies describing the type of planning proposals which will now be supported and which were identified as important to the community during the four-year period of its gestation.

Of course, it should be clear that our Plan does not in itself create planning applications. The Plan will only take effect in practice when developers submit applications which rely on its policies. It should also be recognised that some 11% of the Referendum votes, 59 individuals in number, opposed the adoption of our Plan; however, they and all others, retain the right to object to a planning application on the basis of valid reasons.



#### A Milestone Event

The making of our Plan has the potential to enhance our community by better land use.

There are also immediate benefits; for example, the Parish will gain financially because the percentage of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) received will now increase from 15% to 25%. Seventeen Local Green Spaces have been designated in order to enhance the village scene and protect those areas from further development.

We need to thank all those who have shaped our Plan by contributing views and opinions since 2019 and by participating in the recent consultation sessions - a true community effort.

Printed copies of our Plan are available at the Old School House, 37 Green End Road from Monday to Friday 9 am to 1 pm.

On 13<sup>th</sup> December, this version will be converted to the Made Plan by very minor amendments and will be publicised online and in print as above.

#### Finally...

We should repeat the comments from the Independent Examiner who recommended that our Plan proceeds to Referendum: "... there is no reason to doubt that the community's Vision for the Parish will be achieved... It is clear that local residents value the character of the locality and the wide range of facilities that the village provides". Sawtry's many facets "all contribute to making the Parish an attractive place to live and work."

Slow progress but I think there might be a change of heart on this ridiculous idea but not until next year. I managed to speak on the item which has been shared on my Facebook page. You will be receiving further information on this "opt in or out" payment scheme over the coming months. There will be an annual cost of £57.50 per year to have your Garden waste collected.

We had a tremendous turn out for this year's Remembrance services around the Ward. Thanks, have to go to "Billy" The Chairman of Sawtry Royal British Legion who has worked tirelessly for many years committing a huge amount of his time in supporting many local events.



Waiting at any time of the year is a challenge for some of us but at Christmas it can be especially hard. I read some actual letters that were sent to Santa recently. One of them, written by a four-year old said: 'Dear Santa, I'll take anything you're willing to leave because I haven't been that good!' As we journey through adulthood we discover that having to wait doesn't just belong to the realm of children. So, what are you waiting for this Christmas? What are you longing for?

In Luke's gospel we read of two characters who rarely feature on the front of Christmas cards and never appear in nativity scenes. Nevertheless, they have a key part to play in the Christmas drama because they speak to us of how Jesus can fulfil our deepest longings and hopes.

Simeon was waiting for someone who would bring comfort to the people of Israel who found themselves in a difficult place. Among the Jews of the day a popular title for the Messiah was Comforter. In my experience of sharing life with other human beings Simeon's desire for someone to come and make a difference is a universal one. All of us need to know we are not alone and Immanuel, 'God with us' comes to meet that need.

Anna was waiting but she was waiting for freedom – the kind of freedom that is only possible through forgiveness. Are you wrestling with guilt, or held by a pattern of sin you can't seem to break out of? Jesus comes with the desire and power to set us free.

What are you waiting for this Christmas? Will you allow Jesus to minister his comfort and grace? Will you allow him to be more than a mere baby in a manger but King of Kings and Lord of Lords 'risen with healing in his wings'?

# Minestrone Soup 🕾 🕾 👁 💿

Cooking time: around 30-40 minutes

# Ingredients

1 tin cannellini beans or butter beans, drained and rinsed

1 small onion or 1/4 tin chopped onions 2 large carrots or 1 tin carrots drained

Equipment

1 tin chopped tomatoes 2 tbsp tomato purée


I vegetable stock cube in 1200ml

150g dried spaghetti, (break into short boiling water (4 mugs) lengths)

1 tbsp oil

# **Optional Ingredients**

2 peeled potatoes or ½ tin potatoes 2



Potato peeler (optional)

Sharp knife

tsp garlic powder/puree

# Method

- Finely chop the onion, carrots and potatoes
- Heat the oil in a saucepan over a medium heat
- Add the onion, carrots, garlic and potatoes and cook for about 10 minutes, stirring from time to time until the vegetables are soft
- Add in the tomato puree, tomatoes and stock
- Cover with a lid and bring to the boil over a high heat
- Reduce heat and gently simmer for 10 minutes
- Add the beans and pasta and cook for a further 10 minutes, or until the pasta
- Can be served with bread if liked.

Coeliac/gluten free adaption: Use gluten free spaghetti and check stock cubes are gluten free.





# Method

- If using fresh potatoes peel and cut them into quarters
- Roughly chop the onion
- Heat the oil in a saucepan and pan-fry the onion on a medium heat for 2-3 minutes until softened
- Add the corned beef/stewed steak, potatoes, carrots, chickpeas (if using) and stock, and bring to the boil over a high heat
- Reduce heat, cover with lid and gently simmer for 20 minutes or until the potatoes are tender
- Add more water as needed
- Stir in gravy granules to thicken and pepper to taste before serving



#### SAWTRY COLTS

It's been a busy time of late for the Colts sides strutting their stuff at Greenfield, Sawtry Junior Academy and Sawtry Village Academy. The weather has been pretty typical for this time of year - good, footballing weather with it mostly being wet or windy or a combination of the two! The pitches have continued to be playable but a few weeks have been touch and go. Here's a snapshot of how a few of the older teams have fared recently.

The U16 team have been competitive in all their matches bar their two games against the top two sides Buckden and Eynesbury. They have yet to add to their opening day win but are beginning to gel better as a team with a few new players joining the team this season after a few years away from football.

The U12 Yellows sit third in their league with 4 wins and a draw in their six games so far. Recent league wins against Sandy, Warboys and Needingworth have pushed them up the table but cup matches have been taking the limelight of late for them. A 5-3 win in the County Cup against Orton was swiftly followed by a penalty shoot-out win against Buckden in the league cup after a 2-2 draw. Unfortunately, any early hopes they had of a treble this season were dashed by the Sawtry Blues who defeated them 3-1 in the next round of the County Cup!

The U12 Blues, after losing their first match of the season, are now on an unbeaten run of seven matches. League wins have come against March and Huntingdon with a draw against Papworth. County Cup wins against Needingworth, Stanground and the Sawtry Yellows means they have a quarter final match

against Peterborough RTC to look forward to! A comfortable league cup win against Warboys means their chance of silverware is still alive in that trophy too.

The U12 girls' team (the Sawtry Falcons), in their first season of competitive football, are proving a match for more established local teams culminating in a recent 2-1 win against previously undefeated and current league leaders Netherton and a narrow loss in the cup quarter final to Girls Utd.
