




SAWTRY HISTORY SOCIETY

We are now opening the History Archive on the Saturday following our Thursday meetings, in the Community Centre access via the library, from 10:00 to 12:00.

All are welcome, search census records and view old documents relating to the Sawtry area.

April saw the return of Stuart Orme, curator of the Cromwell Museum with Local Links to the Sinking of the Titanic April 1912, a fact packed talk on the fatal voyage. The family that suffered the greatest loss of life came from Peterborough, John Sage who had been a publican and a baker died with his wife and nine children, only one of their bodies was found that of a 13 year old boy called Will.



The regular June meeting is to be replaced with a *Tour of Sawtry Abbey Site* on Saturday 17 June at 10:30am and will last for around two hours, look out for final details.

The Society went through some changes at the AGM, in March with both the Chairman and the Secretary standing down along with two other members of the committee. QUINTUPLICATION - PART FIFTEEN PUTTING ON THE BRAKES

In 1986 there was issued, for all to see, the Cambridgeshire County Structure Plan. In response, the parish was invited to comment on the kind of village (yes, village) that they wanted in the coming years. Sawtry was being described by many people as *just one vast building site!* New roads were added to the map every year and there seemed to be no end to this expansion. Developers would seek to get as many houses as possible on to their sites. Roads both within the village and on the A1 were congested. We had done our best to try and keep up with all the supporting facilities that should follow new housing. But many felt that it was all becoming too much. Schools were bursting out and, in 1977, the three schools had many mobile overflow classrooms. And, when the field that had been reserved for an expanding Junior School was sold off *for housing* people got worried. At the recreation level the local football club, with ten teams and only one proper pitch of its own, were pleading for help. Owners were reluctant to sell unless housing was part of the deal. There was very little sheltered housing for the elderly. An expected Health Centre never appeared. We had a modest industrial estate, but it was only partly developed, and 92% of working people commuted elsewhere. Traffic on and off the A1 was a headache and drainage of low-lying land became an increasing problem.

Quite simply Sawtry had grown far, far faster than anywhere else! Over these years while other places might grow twice as big, Sawtry's growth has been five times! And now the County wanted us to grow even more. So, in 1987, the Parish Council responded with a campaign called *Quintuplication Is Enough!!!* Here's how much the village had grown:

Up to 1971: 626 houses. Up to 1976: 969 houses. Up to 1981: 1211 houses. Up to 1986: 1704 houses, and now, on top of these, another 300 – 420 houses were proposed. This would look best as a diagram, hand drawn back then ...

Thus the 1963 population of 1000 was now approaching 5,000! And, in 1988, the Council opened up debates around a paper entitled *What Sort of Sawtry?* and held

some well-supported public meetings.

The outcome? It is good to note that the authorities *did* listen to our concerns and there was, in the coming years, a

levelling off in growth. Had it all been worth it? That is for the present inhabitants to say. Personally, I am no longer a villager! I now live in a town... of two thousand!



AN EYE ON NATURE

It's all about providing nature with a home. My garden started out with a lawn, three eucalyptus trees and a guelder rose bush. I recorded very little birdlife at any time and for the RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch (www.rspb.org.uk/get-involved/activities/birdwatch) recorded just one sparrow. I needed to sort this out!

The first things to go were the eucalyptus trees, replaced with a mixed hedge of native shrubs and trees. Oh and my favourite apple varieties Spartan and Russet. These apple trees were not just for me but now provide wonderful perches for my robins when they are hunting insects. The lawn became a meadow in 2017 and nest boxes went up for robins, bluetits and swifts.

So far, the bluetits have nested for three years and the robins this spring. I have had no success with the swift boxes as yet, but have four more boxes going up shortly in a different place. All was not lost though as the sparrows love the existing boxes and I have a thriving population.

The story of my meadow (aka the back garden lawn) continues as I learn more about good management practice. The variety of flowering plants increases as I add to the mix. Mowing still takes place in one area as the starlings and blackbirds need to access worms and grubs. They cannot do this in two foot high wild flowers and grasses.

I have learned some disturbing facts this year which have certainly shaped my thinking. The UK is in the bottom 10% of countries in the world for wildlife protection and loss and 60% of our insect population has disappeared over the last 20 years. If you can remember driving back in the 1970s, after a long trip the windscreen was almost covered in insect splats and was dangerous to look out of before a good clean. These days I can drive for days without any difficulty seeing the road ahead.

What does this all mean for us in 2023? Our wildlife needs help and we can give it with a little effort. Small things, such as providing nectar for insects with a good range of flowers, water for birds and somewhere to nest. Leave a patch of lawn uncut until September. Grasses will seed and flowers bloom during the summer then. Going further, provide a hedgehog house, bee hotel, nest boxes and if suitable, a pond (no matter how small).

All these things will help to create mini nature reserves which will help to turn back the continuing decline in our wildlife so that we in the UK will no longer be bottom in providing for our natural world.

If you are not already registered to order your medication online you will need to collect an Online Services Application Form (for Appointments Online and Repeat Medication) so that we can get you set up to use the new system.





HOW TO TAKE A REAL REST

Summer often brings with it opportunities for holidays and rest, though increasingly we live in a society that doesn't seem to value these concepts. For Christians though regular rest is not to be reserved only for scheduled holidays. In Genesis 2 we read, 'By the seventh day God had finished his work, and so he rested. God blessed the seventh day and made it special because on that day he rested from his work.' The message is plain: "If creation didn't crash when God rested it won't when we do". Jesus himself frequently withdrew to quiet places to be restored, commune with his Father and be 'refuelled.' Too often the temptation is for us to model Jesus' active ministry, but our calling is to follow the pattern of his life.

In Matthew 11:28-30 we read: "Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion? Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me and work with me - watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace. I won't lay anything heavy or ill-fitting on you. Keep company with me and you'll learn to live freely and lightly." It isn't about trying to see how thinly we can spread ourselves before we disappear!


As well as helping us to rest and gain perspective, Sabbath living helps us to connect with those around us without seeing them as obstacles that slow us down. "A hurry-sick world accepts shallow relationships as the necessary price of achieving our individual ambitions." It also helps reaffirm our dependence on God.

Whatever the weather and however you spend your Summer, may you with me find time to receive and enjoy God's gift of Sabbath. On that note I'll leave you with a story of a little girl who went to visit her grandmother. This lady went to church that kept the Sabbath by forbidding all work, fun, and playing. The little girl woke up on Sunday morning and started playing and laughing, as little girls do. Her grandmother immediately scolded her for breaking the Sabbath. The little girl went to church and later went for a walk out by the barn. She went over a droopy eyed, sad faced, long-eared old mule. She looked at the mule and said, "Mr. Mule, you look like you go to my grandmother's church!"

THE "PAPYRUS" WAY - 100TH ANNIVERSARY TEN INTERESTING FACTS

- 1. The 1923 Derby Winner, *Papyrus*, was owned by Sawtry farmer Ben Irish who lived in the Manor House by the Green.
- 2. 'Our' horse was bought and trained for Mr Irish by Newmarket trainer Basil Jarvis who also trained a horse called *Periosteum* to win the 1921 Ascot Gold Cup for Mr Irish.
- 3. Papyrus won six of his eight races as a two-year old and went into his summer break joint favourite for the 1923 Derby.
- 4. As a three-year old, despite being short of full fitness, *Papyrus* finished fourth in the 2000 Guineas.
- 5. Three weeks later, he travelled north to contest, and win comfortably, The Chester Vase, This race was, and still is, a valuable Derby Trial over the same distance.
- 6. When Derby Day arrived, *Papyrus* was second favourite at 100 to 15 (about 7 to 1) with a horse called *Town Guard* starting at 5 to 1.
- 7. On a rather damp, cold day the race was watched by a huge crowd of 250,000 people including Edward, Prince of Wales.
- 8. Top jockey and winner of the previous two Derbys, Steve Donoghue, took the ride on *Papyrus*.
- 9. In the race *Papyrus* took the lead coming into the home straight, was briefly headed but bottled back to win by a length. *Town Guard* finished down the field. Ben Donoghue was congratulated by the King, George V at Buckingham Palace two days later.
- 10. Papyrus finished second in the St Ledger, the last 'Classic' of the season. He then travelled to the USA when challenged to a match race against American champion 'Zef', where he finished second.



Fruity Custard Crunch 🕾 🔇 🚱

Serves 4

Cooking time: around 15 minutes

2 tins fruit eg. peaches, stewed apples, (if using dried fruit soak in a little water 1 tin custard (can also use tinned rice pears, apricots, mandarins, dried fruit for a couple of hours beforehand) 1 mug (120g) porridge oats or pudding or semolina)

When serving pour over the fruit juice as a sweet

Most of our services are run from our own purpose-built CARESCO Centre in the heart of the village.




